Lesson Three: Examples of Campus Ministry

Once you've established a Campus Huddle Coach and a Student Leadership Team is in place, it's time to develop the structure of your Multi-Sport Huddle Meetings!

Part 1 – Leadership Team Models: In developing your Student Leadership Team, there are two types of models FCA encourages →

- 1) **Position-Based Leadership Team** parallels the gifts and talents of a student leader with a specific position in a leadership. A student serves in this position for a year.
- 2) **Task-Based Leadership Team** assigns differing tasks to each leader based on their gifts and talents. These assignments are not limited to a specific time; it could be for one week, one month, or one semester.

Part 2 – Huddle Ministry Strategy: A Multi-Sport Huddle Meeting is a small group Bible study for coaches, athletes and all whom they influence. The purpose of these meetings is evangelism, discipleship, outreach, and fellowship using the platform of athletics. It is vital that you know who your target audience is and what the fundamental purposes are in your ministry.

- **Target Audience:** there are three types of audiences:
 - Huddle Members – students who regularly attend your Huddle events and meetings.
 - The Athletic Community – comprised of all teams, coaches, and athletes.
 - The Entire Campus – it is exactly that...the entire campus!
- **Purpose:** the four fundamental purposes are:
 - Share – this is evangelism or sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ on your campus.
 - Seek – this is discipleship or seeking to grow and mature as a follower of Jesus Christ.
 - Lead – this is reaching out to others through servant leadership that draws them to faith and growth in Jesus Christ.
 - Love – this is fellowship or building relationships with others.
- **Target audience + Purpose = Ministry Impact**

Part 3 – Multi-Sport Huddle Meeting Structure:

For your Huddle Meeting we suggest your meeting structure consist of four parts:

1. _____: greeting and announcements
2. _____: ice-breakers, games, skits, etc.
3. _____: Bible studies, devotionals, and testimonials (spiritual growth component).
4. _____: closing comments

Pulling it all together FCA provides us with the Multi-Sport Huddle Meeting Agenda. This form is used to organize each meeting by identifying your PURPOSE, TARGET GROUP, and organizing your 4 PART STRUCTURE.
